# Profile of 2017 Graduates

**886** total graduates

**905** degrees were earned:

- **482 (53%)** in transfer programs (A.A. and A.S.)
- **383 (42%)** in career programs(A.A.S.)
- **40 (4%)** in certificate programs

# 2017 Graduate Follow-Up Survey

- **401 (45%)** of graduates participated in the graduate follow-up survey; these statistics reflect their responses
- **90%** of graduates are either employed full-time or continuing their education full-time
  - **187 (47%)** of respondents are employed full-time
  - **173 (43%)** of respondents are attending college full-time
- Respondents were hired by **204** different employers
- **198 (49%)** of respondents transferred to **66** different colleges



# Adult Basic Education Program

The Adult Basic Education (ABE) Program at FLCC offers a free TASC Prep Program with open enrollment throughout the year that serves to prepare individuals to successfully pass the TASC test (formerly, GED) and earn a high school equivalency diploma from NYSED. Participants in this program work closely with career advisors at FLCC for help with employment and continuing education. ABE also offers free ESL courses throughout the region.

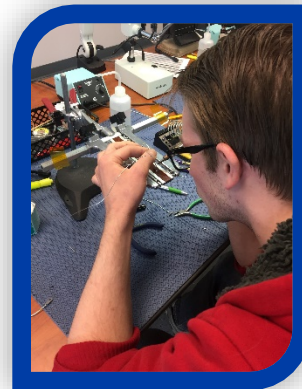
# Advanced Manufacturing Training Programs
